

# A REPORT

The Aravind Eye Hospital was started in March 1976 with a bed strength of 20-Two of the rooms were air conditioned and five had attached bath and toilet facilities.

Another 30 beds were added in the annexe building in September 1977.

The Hospital from the start has facilities for all types of Eye surgery, such as, Surgery for Retinal detachment, Vitreous surgery. Cataract and Glaucoma surgeries, Corneal grafting, squint- Physical and surgical correction and ophthalmic plastic surgery.

At present, the hospital is housed in a 5 storeyed building, built at a cost of Rs.60 lakhs. It is fully equipped with modern imported instruments. The building has three Operation theatres; a large auditorium and a Library in the basement, Central sterilisation room, Clinical Laboratory and an Optical shop.

For inpatients, individual rooms with attached bath and toilets and air conditioned rooms are available. The present bed strength of the Hospital is 150.

### FREE EYE CAMPS

Free eye examination and eye operation camps are being conducted by Aravind Eye Hospital. Eye examination camps are organised every day in rural areas to benefit the rural public. The Hospital has 3 motor vans for this purpose. Two vans have been Donated by the Royal Commonwealth society for the Blind and the other by Gurusamy Naidu Medical Relief Trust, Udumalpet. At these camps, Eye examination is carried out as in a modern Eye out-patients clinic. Refraction is done and glasses prescribed. Glasses are dispensed and delivered at the patients' doors at a nominal cost. Those who need surgical treatment are advised to come to our Base free hospital. Minor ali ments are treated there itself.

Operation camps were conducted at Theni, T. Kallupatti, Gopichettipalayam (twice), Sivakasi, Nagercoil, Rasipuram, Kumarapalayam, Udumalpet, Kallikulam, Uthagamandalam, and Coimbatore (twice).



# TRAINING PROGRAMME

#### **DOCTORS**

Aravind Eye Hospital has been recognised by the Indian Medical Council for training Doctors for the National Board Examinations (MNAMS) in Ophthalmology. Six candidates are admitted each year for this training.

#### OPHTHALMIC NURSES

Women candidates who have completed High School studies are admitted for training as ophthalmic nurses. The training is for 18 months, and is based on the line of training imparted in Moorfields Hospital, London. A stipend of Rs.80 per month is paid to each candidate during the course of training. They are provided free accommodation in the premises of the Hospital. So far 4 batches of students have completed their training and the 5th batch is under training. This training programme was inaugurated by Dr. Leydhecker in January 1978. Those who completed the training have been employed in our Hospital.

### OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANTS

Men and women candidates are given training for a period of one year as ophthalmic assistants. They are given training in Refraction. Checking of visual fields, estimation of ocular tension and checking patency of Lacrimal ducts etc. They can detect Cataract, Glaucoma and common ocular refractive errors.

# SATELLITE HOSPITALS

The Aravind Eye Hospital bestows its technical service to Seethalakshmi Hospital, Gobichettypalayam and the Blisy Eye Hospital Uthagamandalam.

A branch hospital is functioning at Theni, an industrial centre, 75 km. away from Madurai since January 1980. At present out-patient services only are catered and very soon in-patient facilities for 40 patients are to be provided.

It is planned to start 20 more eye Hospitals in various parts of Tamil Nadu. These hospitals may be run by Govel Trust or any other agencies with technical assistance from Aravind Eye Hospital.

#### COMMUNITY WORK

With the help of the Madurai Rotary club, known diabetic patients were screened for ocular manifestations of diabetes on 2nd and 3rd June, 1979 and on May 31& June 1, 1980.

### RESEARCH

At present Research work is being done on:

- 1. Eale's Disease
- 2. Fungal corneal ulcers
- Early detection of glaucoma in rural areas and developing suitable operations for people who cannot have medical treatment.
- 4. Research in resistance to cataract surgery.


